Allium acuminatum - Hooker's Onion

This onion has a pleasing display of 7-25 showy rose colored flowers clustered above its grass-like leaves like little fireworks. This small, rare western onion likes sunny sites and well-drained soils. Use in containers or rockeries. Native from Vancouver Island to Fraser Canyon in rocky, sandy sites (very drought tolerant).

Divided leaflets with small showy creamy-white flowers held above the foliage. This anemone, or windflower, blooms sporadically throughout the season and the woolly seeds are as attractive as the flowers. A charming plant for the rock garden, perennial bed or wildflower meadow.

Syn. *Pulsatilla occidentalis*. A unique sub-alpine plant with large creamy-white flowers that later turn to feathery-hairy, silky, showy seed heads on tall stems. It grows well in sunny moist well-drained sites in raised beds or rock gardens. Keep away from children's play areas as the leaves can cause skin irritation.




Camassia leichtlinii - Great Camas

Great camas' impressive bluish-violet blooms are 5-7cm in diameter. Great camas flowers about two weeks later than common camas and the flowers progressively open upward from the base of the raceme. Great focal point at the back of a perennial bed, at the pond edge, or grouped in containers. Blooms slightly later than Common Camas.

An edible, showy bulb with pale to deep blue flowers. Likes rich moist soils in spring and summer drought. Perfect for a wildflower meadow, this spring bloomer can be mowed in the summer. Camas comes from a word meaning 'sweet' and was a prized root food.

Cardamine pulcherrima - Beautiful Bittercress

Charming plant with pink flowers in spring. Establishes well under trees where there is little competition from other plants and can be mixed around ferns for spring colour. The attractive dark green foliage disappears soon after blooming. It's a larval host for Orangetip and Margined White butterflies.

Magenta to lavender flowers with a waxy purplish ring, similar to cyclamen blooms. Prefers winter/spring moister in sunny to partial sunny sites followed by summer drought (coastal weather). Grows well in rock gardens, near ponds, or edging flower beds.

Erythronium oregonum - White Fawn Lily

A stunning spring bulb with mottled lance-shaped leaves and large, white nodding blooms with the tepals bent back. The flower center is marked orange-yellow and the foliage disappears soon after blooming. Over time it may spread to form a showy colony.

Fritillaria affinis - Chocolate Lily

A subtly beautiful native bulb with mottled dark purple flowers that are pollinated by bees. Its cousin, Rice Root is pollinated by flies. Chocolate lily can have multiple blooms on a single stem. It does well under deciduous trees, well-drained flower beds or in a rock garden.

Showy orange flowers spotted maroon-wine appear in early summer. Older plants give a greater number of flowers. The brighter the location of planting, the more flower-heads per lily stalk. Likes sun to light shade and well-drained sandy soils rich in humus. The bulb was used as a spice or condiment on other foods.

Trientalis borealis - Star Flower

This cute plant resembles a small trillium, but with more petals and leaves. The leaves grow in a whorl and are topped by several wiry stems bearing delicate white to pink star-like flowers. Forms a charming airy groundcover and tolerates drought conditions under conifers.

A large white flower perches on a trio of leaves in spring. Because of its early bloom time Trillium is also called Wakerobin. The flower petals turn maroon as the flower ages. All trilliums are seed grown in our nursery and bulbs are at least four years old before sold. Bulbs will rot in water-logged soils.

Triteleia hyacinthina - Hyacinth Brodiaea

Like a fall crocus, the grass-like leaves appear and as they wither away, stunning umbels of white flowers with bluish-green midveins appear. Plant towards the back of perennial border or in rockeries. Flowers can be dried for winter arrangements.
