Bunchberry is a low deciduous groundcover with a white dogwood flower and bright red berries in fall (inset). They spread by creeping rhizomes into attractive mats. Prefers well-drained soils high in acid and organic matter. Mix bark and peat in soils for planting success or plant on logs.



Crowberry is a slow growing, low-creeping evergreen resembling heather. Has black juicy berrylike drupes with large seeds. Will grow in dry to wet sites. Use to edge perennial borders, in rockeries, by ponds and bogs.

A quick spreading glossy green groundcover in moist shaded places. Ideal in neglected corners, under shrubs, in low light between two buildings, and under shrubs and trees. Bears two heart-shaped leaves and a terminal spiky cluster of tiny white flowers. Later produces yellow berries with brown spots.

A rare evergreen herb of western Vancouver Island and Queen Charlotte Island forests. Has heart-shaped clover-like leaves. Dainty white/pink flowers appear in the fall. Its leaves are held horizontal in the daytime, but they quickly fold vertically at dusk, if they get too much sun, or on rainy days. Spreads rapidly under taller perennials and ferns.

Evergreen basal clump of hairy light green leaves. Produces plantlets on mature leaf blades, which delight children as they 'piggy-back'.
